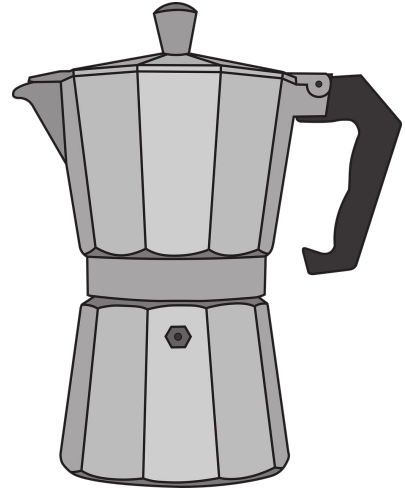

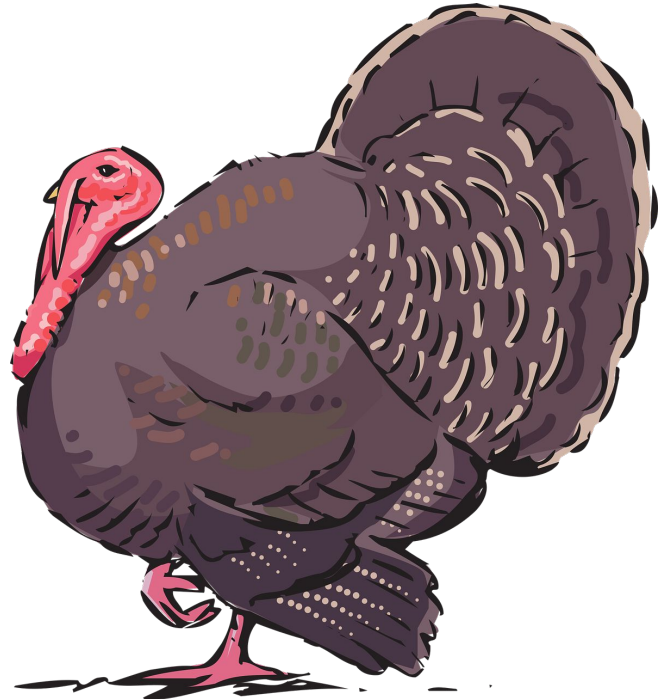
# (See the) Glass (as) Half Empty/Half Full

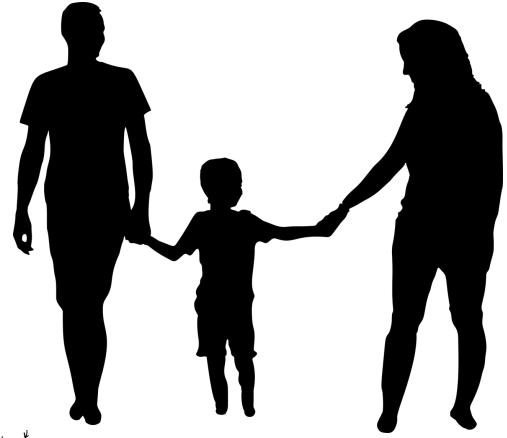
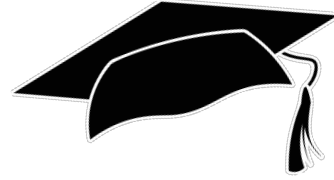
